

Kids Club Winter Workshop

Craft holiday memories with the whole family.



Craft Stick Penguin

YOU'LL NEED

Creatology[™] Items:

- Primary 15.2 cm x 22.8 cm Adhesive Foam Sheets Value Pack
- Craft Sticks, 100 pc.
- Acrylic Paint, 18 pk.
- Assorted Adhesive Wiggle Eyes
- Glitter & Sequin Glue
- Taklon Bristle Paintbrushes, 6 ct.

Other Items:

- Kids' Blunt-Tip Scissors
- 1 Lay out 8 craft sticks side by side, making sure they are even at the top and bottom.
- 2 Glue a craft stick on the backside diagonally across all the sticks to hold them in place. Let the glue dry.
- 3 Paint the penguin make an oval for the belly and paint it white, then paint the rest of the penguin black. Let dry.
- 4 Cut two small black wing shapes from adhesive foam for the arms and attach into place.
- 5 Cut two small orange half circles from adhesive foam for the feet and a triangle for the beak and glue into place. You can use the image as your guide.
- 6 Adhere two wiggle eyes into place with glue.



Clay Peppermint Photo Holder

YOU'LL NEED

Creatology[™] Items:

- Soft Clay, 12 pc.
- Clay Tool Set, 5 pc.
- Bright Chenille Pipe Cleaners, 25 ct.

Other Items:

- Kids' Blunt-Tip Scissors
- Ruler
- 1 Knead white clay in your hands for a few minutes, then roll it into a ball.
- 2 Use the roller from your tool set to flatten the ball. Roll it until it is smooth and fairly thin.
- 3 Now, use the cutting knife from your clay tool set to cut 2.5 cm strips.

TIP You will want to cut 2-3 strips.

- 4 Repeat steps 1-3 with red clay.
- 5 Layer 4-5 strips, alternating white and red.
- 6 Cut the ends so they are even.
- 7 Roll the strips until you reach the desired size. Cut any excess from your roll.
- 8 Cut a chenille pipe cleaner in half and set one half aside for another photo holder or a future project.
- 9 Coil one end of your chenille pipe cleaner a few times. Push the straight end through the top of your rolled clay.
- **10** Set in a safe place to dry for 24 hours.



Watercolour Resist Snowflake

YOU'LL NEED

Creatology[™] Items:

- Kids' Paint Pad, 20 sheets
- Washable Watercolours, 24 ct.
- Taklon Bristle Paintbrushes, 6 ct.

Other Items:

- Kids' Blunt-Tip Scissors
- Crayola[®] Crayons, 8 ct.
- 1 Print and use the template at the back of this guide.
- 2 Turn the printed pattern over so the blank side is facing up. Scribble over the back of the paper, making sure to cover the entire area behind the snowflake image that is on the front. Then, lay it on a piece of paper from the paint pad with the scribbled side down. Trace over the snowflake pattern with a pencil. The pattern will be transferred to your paper.
- 3 Draw over all the lines using a crayon.
- 4 Now, use your watercolour paints to paint inside the snowflake. The crayon lines will resist the paint. Let dry.
- 5 Cut out the snowflake.

TIP You can hang it up if you'd like by punching a hole at the top and threading through some string or yarn.



Holiday Icon Banner

YOU'LL NEED

Creatology[™] Items:

- Primary Foam Sheets Value Pack
- Assorted Cup Sequins
- Chenille Pipe Cleaner, 25 ct.
- Glitter & Sequin Glue
- Plastic Needle

Other Items:

- Kids' Blunt-Tip Scissors
- Everyday Cotton[™] Patterned Yarn by Loops & Threads[®]
- Pencil
- 1 Print and use the template at the back of this guide.
- 2 Trace around each shape onto foam and cut out.
- 3 Decorate each shape using sequins and chenille pipe cleaners.
- 4 Use the plastic needle to punch two holes in the top of each shape.
- 5 Thread yarn through the holes to make a banner.

TIP Make as many shapes as you like for a longer banner.



Mixed Media Christmas Wreath Frame

YOU'LL NEED

Creatology[™] Items:

- Primary Tissue Paper, Square Pack
- Primary Foam Sheets Value Pack
- Glitter & Sequin Glue
- Assorted Cup Sequins
- Everyday Assorted Pom-Poms, 300 ct.
- Acrylic Paint, 18 pk.
- Taklon Bristle Paintbrushes, 6 ct.

Other Items:

- Make Market[®] Wood Frame
- Kids' Blunt-Tip Scissors
- Glue Gun
- Glue Sticks
- Stapler
- 1 Begin by painting the frame green and let dry.
- 2 Roll the tissue squares into balls using the two different greens.
- 3 Glue the balls all over the frame and let dry.
- 4 Decorate the frame/wreath using sequins and pom-poms.
- 5 To make a bow, cut a strip of red foam about 3.8 cm x 20.3 cm. Take each end and fold to the middle.
- 6 Get an adult to staple the bow in the middle.
- 7 Cut a small piece of the red and wrap it around the middle of the bow, then get an adult to hot glue the bow onto the frame.



Yarn-Wrapped Ornament Card

YOU'LL NEED

Creatology[™] Items:

- 22.8 cm x 30.4 cm Paint Pad, 20 sheets
- Silver Adhesive Glitter Foam Sheet
- Taklon Bristle Paintbrushes, 6 ct.
- Round Tip Washable Marker Set, 20 colour

Other Items:

- Everyday Cotton[™] Patterned Yarn by Loops & Threads[®]
- Kids' Blunt-Tip Scissors
- Pencil
- Round object to trace
- 1 Trace a round object onto a sheet of folded paper from your paper pad, leaving the folded edge, and cut out the shape.
- 2 Turn over your glitter foam sheet and draw an ornament topper. Cut out and stick to the top of your ornament.

TIP Use the image as a guide.

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- 3 Cut slits around the outside edge of your ornament starting from one side of the ornament topper around to the other side.
- Wrap yarn across your ornament from side to side. Use the slits to hold the yarn in place. Wrap until you are happy with the overall look of your ornament.
- 5 Cut the yarn from your skein and tie off on the back.
 - Use the markers to write your message on the inside of the card.



Merry Brights Christmas Bracelet Stack

YOU'LL NEED

Creatology[™] Items:

- Christmas Bead Kit, Ornament Shape
- Christmas Bead Kit, Stocking Shape
- Glitter & Sequin Glue

Other Items:

- Kids' Blunt-Tip Scissors
- Toothpick
- Ruler

- 1 To make the stretch bracelet, cut a 25.4 cm length of stretch cord.
- 2 Thread your beads as desired onto the cord.
- 3 Tie the ends of the stretch cord into a tight surgeon's knot, then tuck the ends back through the closest beads.

TIP A surgeon's knot is simply an overhand knot with an extra twist before you pull tight.



Gumball Machine Ornament

YOU'LL NEED

Creatology[™] Items:

- 22.8 cm x 30.4 cm Foam Basic Sheet Value Pack
- Gold Brads Pack, 110 pk.
- Broad Line Washable Markers, 16 pk.
- Everyday Assorted Pom-Poms, 300 ct.
- Glitter & Sequin Glue
- Chenille Pipe Cleaners, 25 ct.

Other Items:

- Make Market[™] Plastic Snap Ornament
- Kids' Blunt-Tip Scissors
- Elmer's[®] Glue Stick
- Stapler
- Ruler
- Pencil
- 1 To make the stand, cut a piece of foam 6.4 cm x 17.8 cm.
- 2 Get an adult to make a loop with it and staple it together at the back. As you attach the foam together, try to make the bottom flare slightly.

TIP Be sure your ornament will sit nicely on the top.

3 To decorate the gumball machine, cut a small white rectangle for the turning mechanism and attach it to the stand using a brad. Push the brad into the white rectangle first, then push it into the stand. Secure the brad by opening the ends flat.

TIP Use the image as a guide for decorating the stand.

- 4 Open the ornament, insert pom-poms, then snap it back in place.
- 5 Use the Creatology[™] glue or get an adult to hot glue the ornament onto the stand. Let dry.
- 6 Use a chenille pipe cleaner to loop through top of ornament to make hanger.



Painted Clay Ornament Dish

YOU'LL NEED

Creatology[™] Items:

- Air Dry Clay, white
- Clay Tool Set, 5 pc.
- Acrylic Paint, 18 pk.
- Kids' Taklon Brush Set, 6 ct.

Other Items:

Small bowl

- 1 Knead white clay in your hands for a few minutes, then roll it into a ball.
- 2 Use the roller from your tool set to flatten the ball and shape into your ornament.
- 3 Use more clay to shape an ornament hanger and attach to the top, front of your ornament.
- 4 Turn over a small bowl and lay your ornament over the bowl.
- 5 Set in a safe place to dry for at least 24 hours.
- 6 Paint as desired. Let dry.



Pop-Up Holiday Card

YOU'LL NEED

Creatology[™] Items:

- 2.5 cm White Pom-Poms Value Pack Paper
- Assorted Cup Sequins
- Broad Line Washable Markers, 16 pk.
- Glitter & Sequin Glue

Other Items:

- Kids' Blunt-Tip Scissors
- Elmer's[®] Glue Stick
- Recollections[™] 21.5 cm x 27.9 cm Sail Away Value Pack Paper, 50 sheets
- Pencil
- Ruler
- 1 To make the box, cut a 15.2 cm x 30.4 cm rectangle from the red cardstock. Fold it in half and glue the sides together, leaving the top open.
- 2 Now, cut a rectangle from white cardstock 3.8 cm x 17.8 cm for the lid of the box. You can make a paper "bow" for the top of the lid if you'd like. You can use the image as your guide.
- 3 Cut another white rectangle 12.7 cm x 12.7 cm so that it will fit inside the red box. Glue it to the white rectangle that is the box lid, so that when you pull off the lid, the white piece comes out. You can add a photo or draw a picture on this piece.
 - Now, decorate the box using paper, sequins, and pom-poms.



Disco Ball Ornament

YOU'LL NEED

Creatology[™] Items:

- 2.5 cm White Pom-Poms Value Pack Paper
- Glitter Adhesive Foam Sheet, 22.8 cm x 30.4 cm

Other Items:

- Kids' Blunt-Tip Scissors
- Make Market[®] Plastic Ornament

1 Get an adult to remove the metal top of the ornament and set aside.

2 Cut squares and rectangles from your glitter foam sheet.

TIP The shapes do not need to be perfect, just free hand your cuts.

- 3 Remove the paper backing and stick around your ornament until it is full and looks like a disco ball. Leave a small gap between each foam shape.
- 4 Fill the inside of your ornament with pom-poms.
- 5 Get an adult to return the metal cap to the ornament.

TIP Add a ribbon or yarn to the loop at the top of your ornament for hanging.



Reindeer Painting

YOU'LL NEED

Creatology[™] Items:

- 22.8 cm x 30.4 cm Paint Pad, 20 sheets
- Acrylic Paint, 18 pk.
- Kids' Taklon Brush Set, 6 ct.

Other Items:

• Pencil


1 Use the reindeer template at the back of this guide. Print or have it up on your screen to use as a guide.
